Help The Blind Foundation Hong Kong organized a meaningful luncheon at the Hotel Holiday Inn in Hong Kong on December 5th, bringing together generous donors and well-wishers in support of their cause. The event witnessed a robust turnout, with numerous donors and well-wishers in attendance. Notably, two Trustees from India flew in to actively participate in the proceedings, underlining the global reach and commitment of the Foundation.

During the gathering, the Foundation provided a comprehensive overview of its impactful activities. Mr. Nataraj, one of the Trustees, delivered a concise yet insightful presentation on the diverse aspects of visual impairment. He eloquently portrayed the daily challenges faced by individuals with visual impairments, shedding light on societal perspectives and emphasizing the Foundation's efforts to reshape attitudes, particularly at the employer level, through awareness sessions. Mr. Nataraj went on to introduce the EMET skills training program, connecting the audience to a live class in Nagpur, India. This interactive session allowed guests to engage with students, offering them a firsthand experience of the program's impact. The significance of assistive devices, especially laptops, in the lives of visually impaired individuals was highlighted. Thanks to the generous support of donors, the Foundation has been distributing laptops to visually impaired students, fostering independence, particularly in education and employment. In a notable development, Mr Nataraj introduced the Smart Vision Glass (SVG), one of the latest assistive devices. Utilizing artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning (ML), the SVG empowers visually impaired individuals to read text, recognize persons, navigate with reasonable autonomy, and seek emergency assistance. The guests were visibly impressed with the SVG's advanced features, acknowledging and appreciating HTBF's dedication to enhancing accessibility through innovative solutions.

Mr Nataraj also touched upon HTBF's unwavering commitment to facilitating employment opportunities for visually impaired graduates, overcoming challenges such as employer apathy and lack of awareness. Despite these obstacles, HTBF continues to succeed in its mission, exemplifying resilience and determination.

The luncheon served as a platform to not only express gratitude to donors but also to showcase the tangible impact of their contributions in empowering the visually impaired community. HTBF's commitment to fostering independence, changing societal perceptions, and embracing innovative solutions was well-received and applauded by the attendees.
