# Key Highlights of 2024/25



### **Scholarships**

- 3,038 applications received and evaluated over 4 months 2,655 students approved for scholarship
- Funding of **INR 3.22 Crore** approved for tuition, hostel and incentives for academic excellence
- Students studying in **231 colleges in 14 states** across the country



### Skill Development

- **604 students** trained under our flagship Education, Mobility & Employability Training (EMET) Program
- **INR 2.38 crore** total program expenses for the year
- Training students in 40 partner colleges in 14 cities across 7 states



#### **Assistive Devices**

- **309 laptops** distributed to beneficiaries across **9 cities**
- **439 Smart Vision Glasses (SVGs)** distributed to beneficiaries in **15 cities**
- **Eye-health assessment** organized for **low-vision beneficiaries** in **5 cities**
- **Aura Vision Glasses (AVGs)** currently being tested by HTBF staff and will be rolled out to students soon



#### **School Intervention**

- **173 students** currently being trained under the Early Intervention programs in digital literacy, mobility and basic computer skills
- Program **operational in 3 schools** in Tamil Nadu in 2024/25 (Chennai, Thanjavur and Arani)
- Program extended to 4<sup>th</sup> school in **Trichy** coming academic year onwards



#### **Resource Centers**

- New program instated this year to equip schools and colleges with digital infrastructure for the benefit of their VI students
- 7 Resource Centers made operational in 6 cities, thrust is to continue partnering with colleges
- Next stage is to extend similar support to **middle schools**



#### **Placements**


- Scholarship students who graduated in 2021/22/23 surveyed – 26% (406) have secured employment
- **191 EMET students have secured employment** since inception in 2019
- Placement cell continuing to **build corporate partnerships and promote awareness** of VI students' capabilities


#### Who is Eligible to Receive Financial Assistance

- Students with **Visual Impairment of 40% or above**
- Annual family income less than INR 3 Lakh p.a. (~USD 3,500 p.a.)
- 2024/25 onwards, students who display academic excellence are granted additional incentives with their scholarship disbursals
- Secured admission in an HTBF approved college:
  - College should have a NAAC rating of 2.5 or above
  - Or they should have been **established before 2000**
  - HTBF volunteer should be in city to support the students
  - Minimum 5 applicants in a given academic year

# Skill Development

#### **Education Mobility and Employability Training Program (EMET)**

- EMET is a **2-year training** program conducted by HTBF **at students' college premises**
- The program was started in 2018, with the aim of **improving the employability of Visually Impaired students**
- Each student is provided a laptop, as soon as he/she joins the EMET program. The laptop is equipped with a range of assistive technologies, such as screen readers, spelling tools, remote/online learning tools, tactile books, accessible software etc.
- EMET aims to empower VI students and transform them into market-ready professionals through education and training in digital and interpersonal skills


#### EMET Program in AY 2024/25

- EMET is running in 14 cities across 7 states India, training 630 students at the moment. The anchor donor for the program is Cognizant Foundation, ably supplemented by donors such Koshambh Multitred, Brookefields and Guru Krupa Foundation.
- EMET program employs 40 plus staff, as trainers, project officers, and team leads. Out of the 40, 31 (77.5%) are visually impaired
- The EMET program has successfully **helped nearly 200 students secure jobs** after successfully graduating from the course, in conjunction with the activities of the placements team that helps form strategic partnerships and promote awareness.

#### **School Intervention Program (SIP)**

- We have recently initiated a new project, called the "School Intervention Program", where we go to secondary and high schools, and replicate our larger skill development program (EMET), at a preliminary level.
- This is with the aim of equipping VI students with the readiness for a leap forward, as they move from secondary school to college under graduation.
- We support such schools by supplying laptops and setting up good computer labs.
- Our pilot rollouts of this program in three blind schools in Tamil Nadu have yielded significantly positive results, which has prompted us to move forward with the EIP in a 4<sup>th</sup> school in 2025.
- We aim to continue rolling this program out to more secondary and high schools in the future.
- Next Steps: We are working with Xavier's Resource Center for the Visually Challenged (XRCVC) and other organizations with the aim of introducing STEM Education in secondary schools.

### **Resource Centers**

#### **Program Background**

- Installation of Computer Resource Centres (CRCs) in Colleges and Schools was one of our primary new objectives
- The plan is to operationalize CRCs with **25 seated workstations** in each of these institutions, to benefit VI students in them
- As on date, we have identified 7 institutions as part of this program pan-India. We are pleased to update that 4 CRCs have already been inaugurated and are operational as of on date.

#### **Employment Highlights from AY 2024/25**

- MoU signed with Amazon for their employment requirements, recently they recruited 3 beneficiaries
- S. Maharaja, a former beneficiary from Tamil Nadu has been appointed by the Tamil Nadu State Government as a Welfare Officer
- Short Term Training (STTs) to meet industry specific requirements offered to students who have graduated and are looking for a job.
  - A Capability Enhancement Training Program was conducted for EMET students. 13 students participated in this program. 2 students who attended this program secured employment in Amazon and Infosys
- F2Fintech in Delhi recruited 6 of our beneficiaries recently
- After an awareness campaign held for the Forest Department, Chennai, they have decided to hire one candidate for data entry
